Philippines: A 5,3-magnitude earthquake struck the southern Philippines on Thursday, the U.S. Geological Survey said, but there were no reports of casualties or damage.

Tea is a kind of drink consumed by people all over the world. Tea ranks as the most popular drink in more countries than any other beverage. But, there are people who do not drink tea. They say that tea damages kidneys and the surface of teeth. I absolutely disagree with such argument.

The small amount of caffeine found in tea is a stimulant. Caffeine dissolves in water and has crystals that look like needles. People who drink normal black tea distressed more quickly and had lower level of cortisol (a stress hormone) in their blood after a harrowing event. Dietitian Frankie Phillips says it makes no difference if you drink tea by using a bag or loose leaves. But the brewing time will have an effect on the tea. The stronger the tea, the higher the content of polyphonies will be which acts as antioxidants in the body.
